What does Board do to meet legal requirements? Adopt a process and criteria.





Process

Board Process

- Hire a demographic and legal team
- Team briefs Board on timelines/dates, legal requirements, and process
- Board determines how to solicit board input
- Board determines how to solicit public input
 - Public hearings are a must
 - Soliciting input from minority leaders is a must
- Board establishes redistricting criteria
- Board sets timeline



Process (continued)


- Team briefs Board on all relevant census, population, demographic and election data
- Board actively compares and discusses drafts of plan in terms of meeting criteria and makes final decision on this basis
- Board reviews written analysis of final plan which addresses how criteria met

Who's Involved in the Process?

- Board and Superintendent
- Administrator point person, often in business or special projects department


Criteria

Criteria for Drawing SMDs



- Use identifiable geographic boundaries for SMD boundaries when possible
- Maintaining communities of interest such as neighborhoods
- Use or account for other political boundaries:
 - Voting precincts
 - Polling places
- Preserve existing SMD boundaries to degree possible

More Criteria



- Preserve incumbencies
- Adopt SMDs of substantially equal size
- Adopt compact and contiguous districts
- Avoid retrogression
- Make decisions on basis other than race whenever possible to narrowly tailor racial considerations to retrogression issues



Board & Community Engagement

Develop Input/Engagement Model

 Board and public input and engagement are crucial to redistricting to ensure <u>transparency</u> and that <u>all</u> <u>stakeholder voices are heard</u>. The Board, with the assistance of legal counsel, should develop an input/engagement model appropriate for the District.

Input Examples

- **Board** board meetings, workshops, one-on-ones with the legal and demographic team, community meetings.
- <u>Public</u> board meetings, public hearings, community task force, townhalls, SMD- specific community meetings, redistricting website, interactive maps, educational videos for the website, and surveys

When?

- These input channels should occur <u>early</u> and <u>throughout</u> the process at regular intervals so that input received can be incorporated into draft maps.
- The <u>public</u> input channels serve the additional function of educating the public about redistricting requirements, process and timelines, and next steps.

Timeline

When?

- Not later than the 90th day before the date of the first regular trustee election at which trustees may officially recognize and act on the last preceding federal census, the board shall redivide the district into the appropriate number of trustee districts if the census data indicates that the population of the most populous district exceeds the population of the least populous district by more than 10 percent. Texas Education Code §11.052(i).
- The Board is required to hold November elections.
- Therefore, redistricting for November elections will first be implemented at the November 8, 2022 election, and the Board must redistrict by August 10, 2022.

Redistricting Timeline – November 2022

DATE	ACTIVITY
August 2021	Receive federal census data.*
November to December 2021	Board receives legal overview of redistricting process.
	Demographer accesses and analyzes federal decennial census data, including change analysis (2010 to 2020).
	Lawyer and demographer present change analysis to the Board.
	Board reviews (and/or adopts) redistricting criteria, process, and timeline.
January – April 2022	Public education materials released on website and in community forums.
	Approximately 4-6 board meetings, committee meetings, townhalls or public hearings for input on redistricting criteria, including neighborhoods and communities of interest and comment on specific draft plans.
	Demographer drafts alternative plans based on Board/community input.



Redistricting Timeline – November 2022

Board adopts final plan.
First Day to File for Place on Ballot
Deadline to Adopt Redistricting Plan
Deadline to File for a Place on the Ballot Deadline to order election
Election Day
