

Operations



The Operations division has enhanced experiences for students, staff and families, and understands the importance of community development in the site-repurposing initiatives. **Pease Elementary** will now host a year-round early childhood education center operated by the United Way for Greater Austin, opening in fall 2024. The **Anita Coy Facility** will transform into a hub focusing on workforce development, affordable housing and community benefits, with construction starting in summer 2025. Future endeavors will focus on safety, connectivity and sustainability, and foster collaboration for enhanced operations and a stronger Austin ISD community.

- Austin ISD serves nearly 74,871 students on 125 campuses across a 230-square mile district.
- More than 28% of Austin ISD students are emerging bilingual students. Nearly 52% are economically disadvantaged.
- The district enjoys an impressive 92.3% graduation rate, and its composite SAT scores exceed state and national averages.
