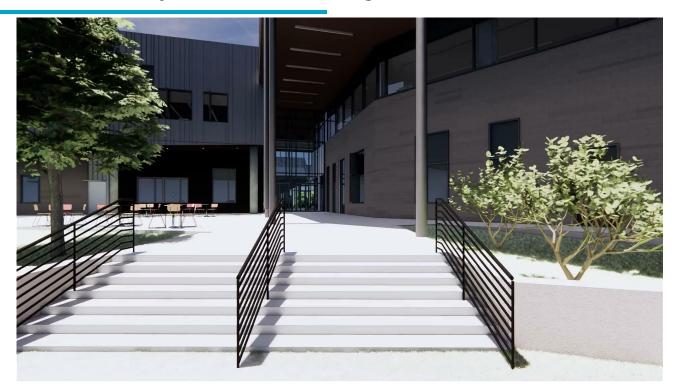

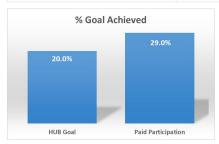

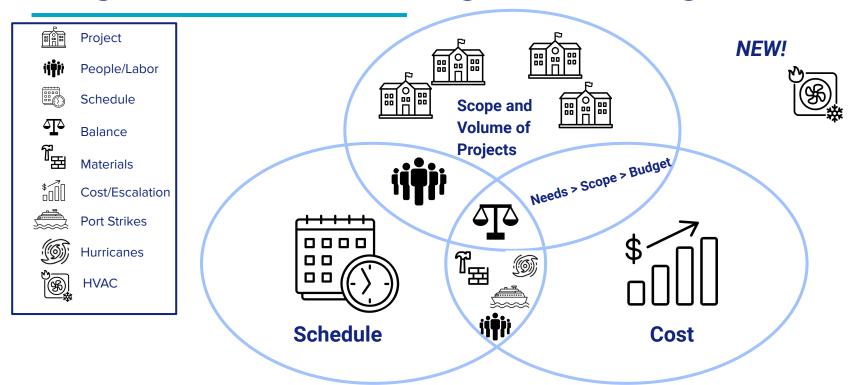

# **Worker Protection Updates**

#### What worker protections have contractors been required to provide to date?

- Contractors involved in bond projects are required to follow industry-standard safety protocols, as mandated by law and outlined in their contracts. The district currently engages third-parties for oversight, and the introduction of these third-parties monitors ensures ongoing compliance with safety standards.
- The <u>September 2022 board resolution</u> outlined many worker protections that were already included in our contracts including federally approved wage rates, fringe benefits, which include health care and paid sick leave, OSHA safety training, a third-party monitor that reviews plans and visits construction sites, and a third-party auditor to assist with any reported wage-related claims.
- Our contracts are being updated to increase the minimum wage for all workers onsite, additional training requirements for workers in supervisory positions, and a goal of achieving 15% labor hours to be performed by local workforce or workers in apprenticeship programs.



# **Worker Protection Updates**

#### What third party services has the district put in place?

- The district awarded a third-party on-site safety monitor through a competitive solicitation process prior to 2022 bond projects starting construction. This safety monitor reviews contractors' safe work plans and performs onsite monitoring once or twice per week minimum. Contractor safety is a priority for Austin ISD.
- Austin ISD also competitively solicited third-party auditing services that address many of the pay wage protection considerations in the board's resolution.
- The contract for third-party monitoring services with Certification Associates completes the remaining component of a monitoring program that meets the intent of the Board's September 2022 resolution.



# **Worker Protection Updates**

#### What process was used to select the third-party monitoring services by Certification Associates?

- The district has been diligently working to establish a third-party monitoring program that meets our board's expectations, adheres to the highest industry standards, and delivers long-term value to the community.
- There have been multiple phases of review and consultations with legal, procurement, operational, and
  financial departments to ensure that the chosen vendor, Certification Associates, would meet the district's
  needs effectively and deliver the best value to the community.
- The district Legal, Construction, and Procurement departments played a role in the acquisition of third-party monitoring services along with the board trustees.
