# Capturing Stakeholder Feedback

- Leverage feedback from **Pre-K Focus Group** meetings
- **Engage in ongoing feedback** with stakeholders, including during community meetings/events, front office staff/registrar training, weekly office hours, principal round tables, cross-departmental meetings
- Explore capturing additional **family feedback through link in Enroll Austin notification emails**

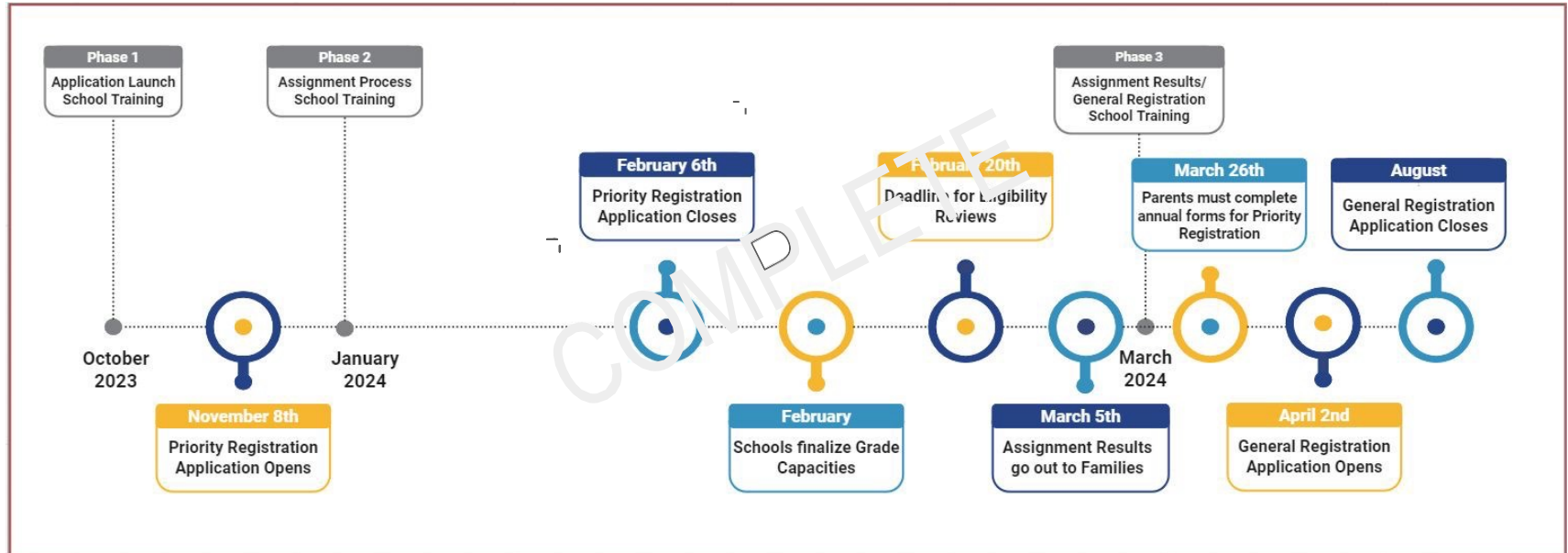

# 24-25 SY Summary

## WHAT WENT WELL?

- ★ **Consolidated Multiple Enrollment Systems and Processes into 1 place for Families**
- ★ **Strong Enrollment Data**
  - 70,022 families successfully submitted an application through Enroll Austin
- ★ **Cross-Departmental Collaboration to Support Families:**
  - The registration events reflected strong cross-departmental support and involvement to assist families
  - The development and implementation of the Enroll Austin application involved collaboration across numerous teams, fostering stronger interdepartmental relationships
- ★ **Campus and District Registration Events and Blockwalks**
- ★ **Family Support offered through Multiple Routes:** Helplines, Let's Talk, Lobby Hours, Emails, On-Site
- ★ **Enroll Austin Champions**
  - Central office staff came together to learn and support families throughout the summer and on weekends



# 24-25 SY Summary

## WHAT WENT WELL?

- ★ **Improved Transfer Process**
  - The transfer process saw substantial improvement, reducing processing time from 6-7 months
- ★ **Elimination of Paper Forms**
  - Helps reduce redundancy, enhances security, and saves money, streamlining the registration processes while providing direct assistance for families who need support
- ★ **System Functionality**
  - The system remained stable throughout the year, with no crashes reported
- ★ **Yearlong Training** was provided to Enroll Austin Designated Campus Users, including weekly Enroll Austin support office hours
- ★ **Robust Enroll Austin Website** for families including FAQs that evolved based on family and campus feedback
- ★ **Additional Tools to assist Families in Selecting Schools**
  - School Finder
  - Campus Videos
  - Informative Campus 1-Pagers



# 24-25 SY Summary

## ✓ AREAS FOR IMPROVEMENT

- ★ **Annual Forms Process was Lengthy for Families**
- ★ **Implementation “Growing Pains” of a Brand New System**
- ★ **Need for Expanded Enrollment Event Locations**
- ★ **Inconsistent attendance at training opportunities**
- ★ **Response times to staff and families during peak times**
- ★ **Communication about the Impact of Ranking School Choices**
- ★ **Some Confusion about Verbiage regarding Results**
- ★ **Timeline for Admission-Based Campuses to process Applications**



# 24-25 SY Summary

## ✓ AREAS FOR IMPROVEMENT

- ★ **Pre-K should not have been included in November**
- ★ **Need for Additional Support with Technical Application Functionality ex: Password Resets**
- ★ **Some Inconsistency Across Campuses**
- ★ **Need for easier way for Families to complete the Home Language Survey**
- ★ **Campus Program Data not reflected in Enroll Austin the First Year**
- ★ **Confusion regarding the role of the Main Designated Registration Contact for the Student**
- ★ **Need to Expand and Enhance Communication Channels**



# Planned Enhancements

Please note that all enhancements are dependent on Salesforce and Frontline functionality and may need to be adjusted accordingly.

## Enhancements for 11/6/24 Priority Registration

- ★ Annual Forms Improvements
- ★ Pre-K Removed from Priority Registration
- ★ Employees can apply to schools that do not allow Out Of District applications
- ★ Home Language Survey (HLS) can be completed directly through a fillable application or brought to the campus
- ★ School programs captured for students
- ★ Updates to campus grade levels
- ★ Application wording improvements
- ★ Adding feedback survey to email

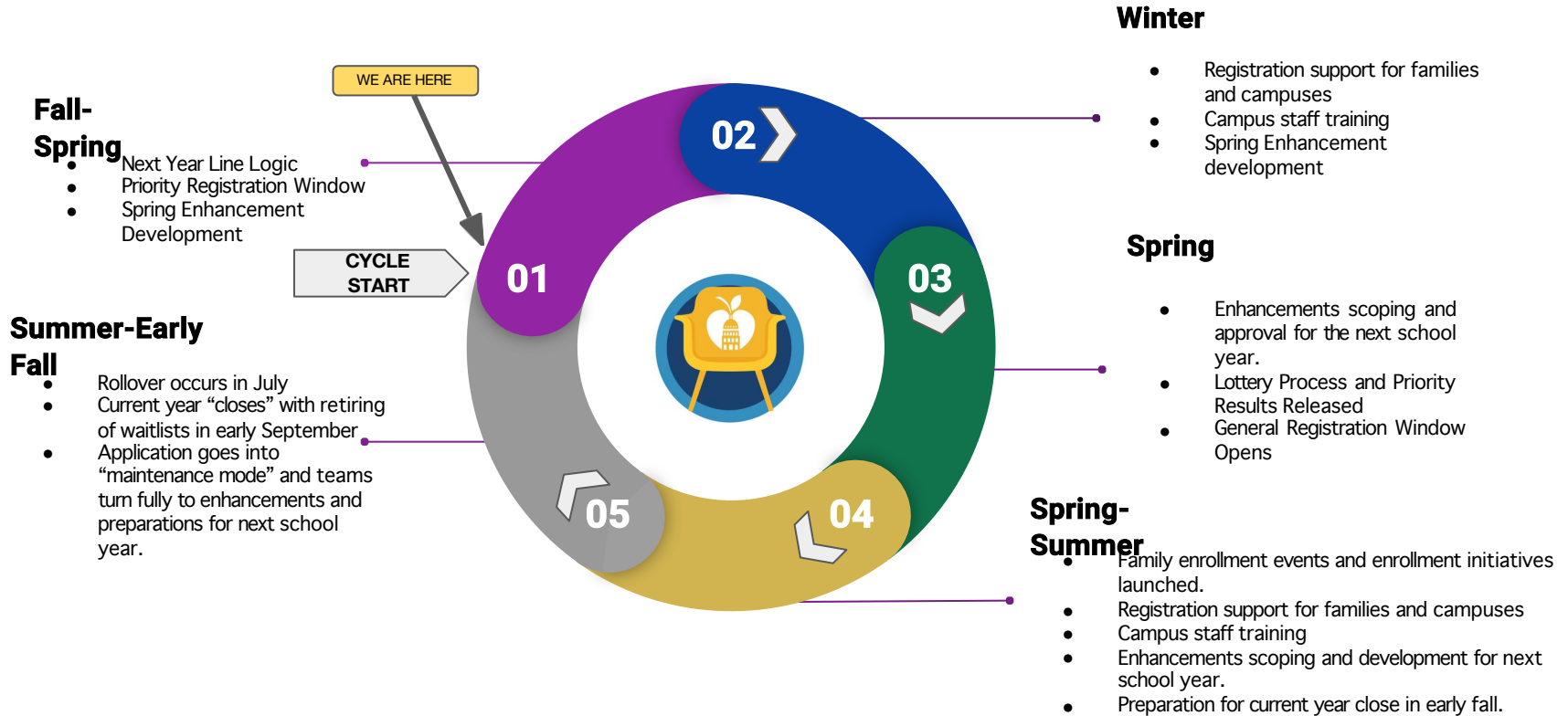
## Enhancements for 3/14/25 Lottery and Results to Families

- ★ Addition of Accept/Decline buttons when families receive results
- ★ Hardship appeals are only available at the start of the school year
- ★ A date and time is recorded and viewable to families when an appeal is submitted
- ★ Applicants that are marked ineligible will no longer receive blank results via email (wording TBD)
- ★ Application based programs can no longer be appealed

## Enhancements for 4/1/25 General Registration

- ★ Pre-K Process and Registration Improvements
- ★ HLS PDF download available to campus users
- ★ Emergency Contacts are updated from Enroll Austin to Frontline SIS

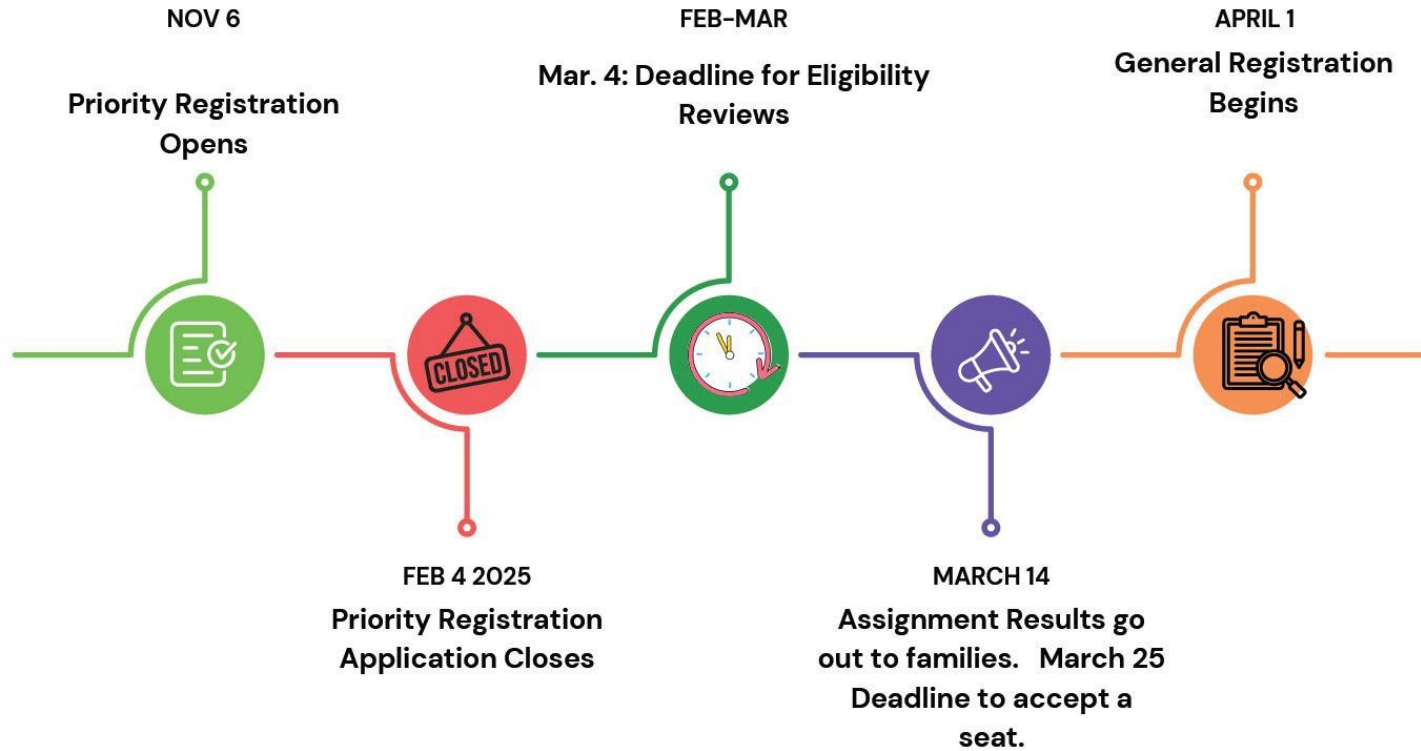




# 25-26 SY Timelines

The Enroll Austin <b>Priority Registration application opens</b> . This will include registration for neighborhood schools, submissions for application-based programs and transfers.	November 6, 2024	Enroll Austin
The Enroll Austin <b>Priority Registration application closes</b> Registration for neighborhood schools, submission for application-based programs* and transfers are due on this date to be considered in the Priority Registration assignment process. <b>Applicants must have completed and submitted all application requirements.</b>	February 4, 2025	Enroll Austin
All applicants will be notified of the <b>results of Priority Registration</b> of the Enroll Austin process- This will include decisions from application-based programs	March 14, 2025	Enroll Austin
<b>Annual Forms must be completed for students that received a seat confirmation during Priority Registration.</b>	March 25, 2025	Enroll Austin
<b>Enroll Austin General Registration</b> will open and applications will be accepted on a first come, first served basis.	April 1, 2024	Enroll Austin
Deadline to submit a <b>General Registration</b> application for the fall semester <b>and Hardship Transfers begin</b> . From this point on, Hardship Transfers are assessed on a case-by-case basis.	6th School Day in August	Enroll Austin

**Please note:** Applications for Anderson High School IB Program, Ann Richards School for Young Women Leaders, Kealing Magnet Program, Lamar Fine Arts Academy (all strands), Liberal Arts and Science Academy (LASA), Lively Middle School: Law, Humanities, and Global Studies Magnet, McCallum Fine Arts Academy (all majors), Small Green Tech Academy Program, Covington Middle School Fine Arts Academy are required to be submitted during Priority Registration.

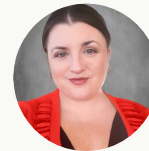

# State Funding

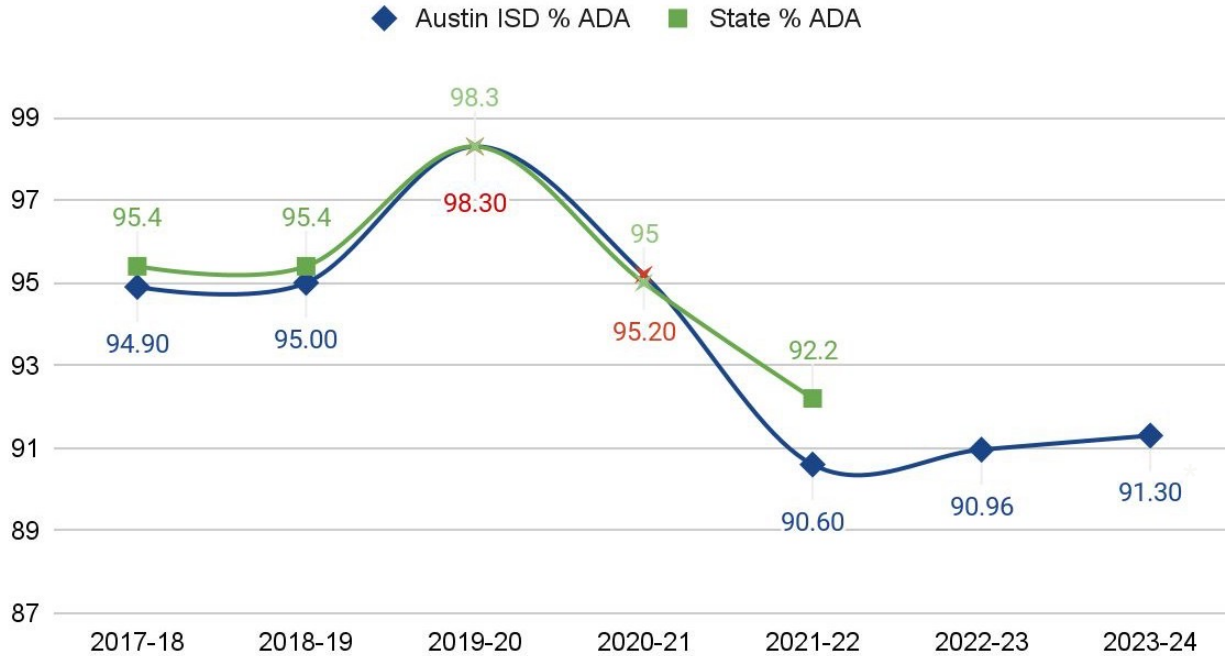


**Texas is one of only 6 states that are funded by attendance (CA, ID, KY, MS, MO, TX)**

Other states are exploring options for enrollment-based funding. In Kentucky, a bill was introduced in 2022 to move to enrollment-based funding beginning in the 2024–2025 school year, though it did not move. California was able to get its enrollment-based funding bill passed through the Senate in 2022, but it did not make it through the Assembly. Idaho temporarily moved to enrollment-based funding during the pandemic, but efforts to make the change permanent failed. During the 2021 Texas regular legislative session, two bills were introduced to move to an enrollment-based funding system, SB 728 and HB 1246. Though these bills had bipartisan support and the backing of many superintendents and other education advocates, neither chamber chose to grant the bills a hearing.

# Types of Absences: Excused

## Funded/Excused

- Medical Appointment (partial day)
- School Activity
- Religious Holy Day
- Required court appearance for student
- Obtain citizenship or naturalization oath ceremony for student
- Serve as voting or election clerk
- High School: Obtain driver's license or driver's permit
- 11th, 12th grade: College and Work Visit

## \*Unfunded/Excused

Campuses do not receive funding for these absences.

- Special circumstances as approved by Principal
- Illness notes from parent or doctor (full day, multi-day)

**\*Unfunded means the district does not receive funding when students are absent**

**International High School (IHS)**

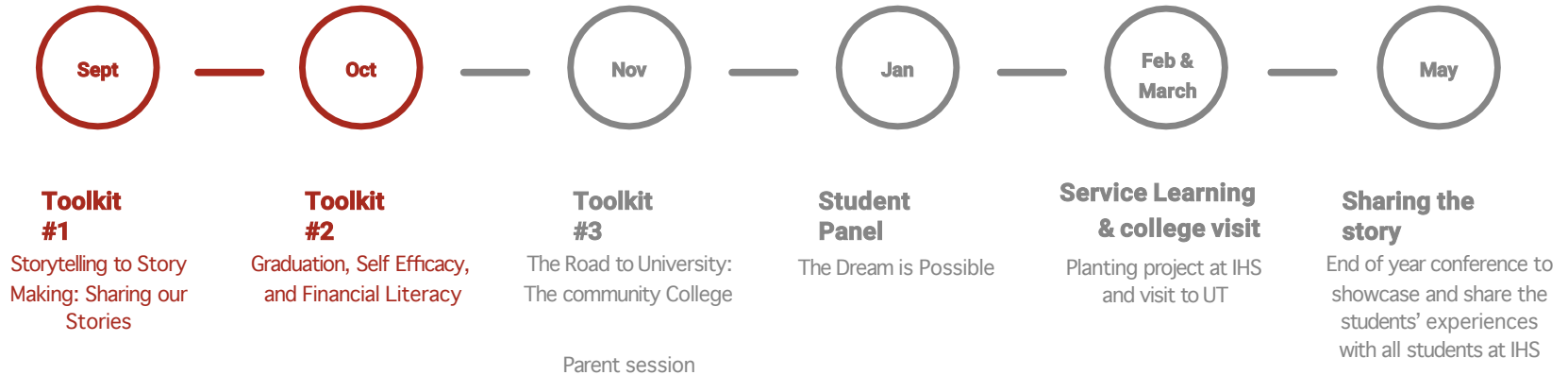
2 year program for students that are 14-16 years of age and in their first year in US schools.
