

 - We are in the final stages of a Request For Qualifications for a School Bus Electrification Implementation Project Manager. The selected entity will assist us in planning the transition to electric school buses.
 - The current EV buses have been well received in many events like Touch-a-Truck, Bob Bullock's Free First Sundays with HEB, and the Planning for Climate Resilience: National Summit for School Leaders.
 - The conversations for the modernization of Nelson Terminal, our largest bus terminal have started. Many sustainability topics will be discussed: EV bus charging stations, wellness aspects, and solar.






(AISD Staff Update) US Department of Energy Renew America's Schools Grant (Update from Darien Clary)

 - Solar panels to be installed at 13 Austin ISD campuses- KVUE- Aug. 27
 - Austin ISD receives \$15M grant toward solar power- Community Impact- Aug.27
 - Austin ISD named only Texas school district to get federal grant to expand solar panel program- KVUE-Aug. 28
- Background: AISD was awarded \$15M from the Department of Energy for rooftop solar and/or building
 automation controls at 15 schools. The project will take 60 months (5 years) to fully implement. Click <u>here</u> for

- (AISD Staff Update) Sustainable Food (Update from Diane Grodek & Lindsey Bradley)
 - We are excited to feature new Fall Menu items including our BBQ Drumstick served with Baked Beans and Pasta Salad, Greek Salads, BBQ Pork Tacos, Succotash, and Alfredo Vegetable Flatbreads in addition to new frozen fruit and dried fruit options.
 - The Food Service Department was awarded a \$5,000 grant from the Sprouts Foundation to support our sampling program that features interesting whole and prepared fruits and vegetables.
 - We contracted a few new plant-based ingredients for this year including a high protein ramen noodle called Woodles, Planetarians Strips which utilize excess yeast bi-product from beer production, and we will bring back our now beloved Rebellyous Vegan Tenders and Patties
 - 77 Schools in Austin ISD will offer free breakfast and lunch to all students this year



(AISD Staff Update) Nature & Outdoor Learning (Update from Colleen Garland & Mandi Golman)

- With Mandi's wealth of knowledge on the team, we are able to expand our reach in the District. Mandi will focus on bond projects and facilities, while Colleen will focus on academics and campus support.
- Following a successful pilot program to host Earth Camp and Earth School at the Metz OWL last spring, CoA Watershed has kicked off this school year with a full schedule of programming to be at the OWL Center!
- As we continue to plan how to redevelop the outdoor spaces at the OWL Center, we have sought community input and feedback through informal meetings, and a survey. The survey responses can be viewed <u>here</u>.
- The Girls+ Outside program was able to secure additional funding this year so that Westcave was able to add two more schools to the program, and hire a part time bilingual educator to support it. I'm looking forward to another incredible year adventuring with them!
