TWILIGHT PROGRAM

Credit recovery. Grade repair. Attendance make-up.

CREDIT RECOVERY

Credit Recovery is a TEKS aligned program for Austin ISD students who failed a required course for graduation. Options can be teacher-led or computer-based.

Teacher-led Credit Recovery

Students will receive support from caring and knowledgeable teachers before/after school and/or Saturdays.

Computer-based Credit Recovery

Students are enrolled in computer-based course(s) needed for graduation before or after school. Coursework is self-paced and available to students 24/7. Students requiring more than one course may begin the next course upon completion of the first course without having to wait for a new grading cycle to begin.

GRADE REPAIR

Available to Austin ISD students who need to repair a failing grade from a past grading cycle and/or current school year.

The campus's Twilight lead works with the student's teacher of record to determine required work/assessments for the student to repair the grade for a given grading cycle.

Twilight teachers provide academic support for students attending Twilight.

Students may continue to work on grade repair during the school day with Principal approval.

ATTENDANCE MAKE-UP

Austin ISD students attending Twilight for attendance make-up may work on grade repair, credit recovery, or make-up work for their classes.

Students can make up attendance for the current or past semester(s).

To account for successful attendance make-up for a high school course for a **past semester**, the Twilight lead on each campus will work with the campus registrar to ensure credit is restored.

To account for successful attendance make-up for the **current semester**, the Twilight lead will work with the grade level administrator to document completion of make-up hours.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Twilight Program provides Austin ISD high school and select middle school students options for credit recovery, grade repair, and attendance make-up. The program assists students who are at risk by offering support during morning/after school extended hours, including Saturdays at some schools. The student must meet with their respective school counselor or administrator, who will refer the student for the Twilight program according to what needs to be recovered.
