2005-2006 AISD Parent Survey Results

The following report contains the results of the 2005-2006 AISD Parent Survey for your campus and all AISD schools at your level. The next section describes the percentages of parents selecting specific responses for each survey item, and the final section indicates the actual number of parents who selected each response option. Please note that due to differences in response rates by campus, ranging from 0.4% to 22.9%, district level results are more influenced by some campuses than others.




USING THE RESULTS OF THE AISD PARENT SURVEY


